MARICOPA COMMUNITY COLLEGES TO TRAIN WORKERS THROUGH WALMART BRIGHTER FUTURES GRANT

TEMPE, AZ – October 15, 2013 – The Maricopa County Community College District has been chosen as one of 12 community colleges and districts in the country to participate in the Walmart Brighter Futures 2.0 Project. The \$3.5 million grant – given to MCCCD through the League for Innovation in the Community College (League) – will help train lower-income, lower-skill adults transition to middle-skill, higher-wage jobs over the next two-and-a-half years.

Participants will also gain confidence that they've acquired the skills employers want, allowing them to document those skills and communicate them effectively to employers. In announcing the grants, League President and CEO, Dr. Gerardo E. de los Santos, expressed confidence that the Walmart Brighter Futures project will have a profound and positive impact beyond the 12 colleges.

"As with an earlier project funded by the Walmart Foundation, Brighter Futures 2.0 will lead to best practices that will expand the capacity of community colleges to enhance middle-skill job training opportunities," said de los Santos. He added that the League will widely disseminate best practices and lessons learned from the project.

Through the project, each selected community college and district will receive up to \$233,333 to provide job training and career counseling. Each participant will be taught how to conduct a proper job search, write a résumé, and prepare for interviews.

"We appreciate the generosity of the Walmart Foundation and the League's assistance in making this work possible," said Maricopa Community Colleges Chancellor Rufus Glasper. "Maricopa's Rio Salado College, South Mountain Community College, Maricopa Skill Center and Southwest Skill Center will use a collaborative approach to train people so they can move toward financial self-sufficiency."

"The Walmart Foundation supports programs that provide people with ways to improve their lives through skills training, job readiness, job placement and support services," says Julie Gehrki, senior director of the Walmart Foundation. "We are proud to continue our work with the League for Innovation and expect to help 9,000 workers gain the skills they need for today's job market through this continued effort."
