Here are some highlights of the findings. The data show that CEOs strongly believe that in the next three to five years:

- options for learning will increase;
- information technology literacy will become a requirement in most academic programs;
- e-commerce expectations by students, employees, and community members will increase;
- training faculty in the use of information technology will be an essential part of staff development;
- legislators will call for more accountability from colleges;
- workforce training/development offerings will continue to expand;
- developing and maintaining partnerships with local corporations will become even more essential; and
- aligning with K-12 and university institutions will be increasingly important.
