
Ellsworth Community College (ECC)



Using Service-Learning to Deepen Students' Understanding of Course Contents

Service-learning has long been an effective way to help students develop a richer understanding of a subject and also apply what they are learning in a tangible way. Bringle and Hatcher (1996) defined service learning as: "a credi bearing, educational, experience in which students participate in an organized service activity that meets identified community needs, and reflect on the service activity in such a way as to gain further understanding of course content, a broader appreciation of the discipline, and an enhanced sense of civic responsibility." Well-designed and implemented service-learning projects can have a significant impact on the undergraduate experience of students

Volunteers




